[b] Future Projects; a leader application for different projects needs to be assembled, Under consideration; Post Office Bridge, Gordale and Tarn Signpost, Road verges, Toilet improvements, Community Centre,

Such an application should come from the Parish Council after preparation by the Malhamdale Initiative, J Tod will search for further volunteers for the Initiative

[c] Village Green Our solicitor has written to the Cawoods' solicitor confirming that the offer of payment of monies in instalments is not acceptable to the PC and offering a counter offer whereby both parties would discontinue their respective claims. Cawoods' solicitor has responded that their clients are interested in pursuing this option and asking the PC to investigate feasibility of an alternate access route with planning authorities. The alternative being not on the PC's land, our solicitors have written to ask for acceptance or otherwise of the PC's offer

[d] Traffic and Transport Notes of the recent meeting have been circulated to all Parish Councillors. No significant reduction in parking places is planned, ideally street parking should be short stay with allowance for resident parking. Disc parking was suggested with Hambleton and Harrogate quoted as examples. Any application for restriction should go in soon. Further yellow lines for the bottom of the brow and Chapel Corner will be applied for by the Clerk as will a request for the information about traffic regulation, it was suggested that this be by separate letters to avoid delay on the yellow lines.

On signage, Highways are responsible for speed restriction and narrow road signs, Village signs are our responsibility. C Wildman and NY representatives walked the villages looking at signs. 7 could be removed, some replaced by smaller ones, perhaps mounted on walls with the resident's agreement. Signs remaining are to have their poles painted black.

S Marshall informed about a letter due about salt bins and piles.
