The aim of a scheme is to enable the community to provide a source of information to raise resilience thus help implement an effective response to incidents. Such a scheme would raise awareness of potential risks, how to mitigate them and speed up restoration to normality. A scheme would need to study the Dale, its access routes, assets both public and private, also identify the skills already present in the community as well as the most vulnerable residents. It is sometimes difficult to imagine a large scale emergency in Malhamdale, just as it was difficult to imagine or foresee the Lockerbie disaster.

Following the talk, questions and answers it was decided that we should form a plan and a committee to organise it. It will appear on our next agenda for discussion.

J Tod informed that permission for the access track has been approved with conditions, there was no 106 agreement clause and no explanation why this clause was excluded, Mr Cawood has been informed.

National Park Authority's position since October 2007 that before granting such consent a 106 agreement would have to be signed by both applicants. The need for a 106 has been a bone of contention for over 2 years, with increase in legal fees for both parties..

[c] Traffic and Transport

We have a letter from NYCC about the shortage of salt and the winter road maintenance over spend due to severe weather. The road between Gargrave and Malham is a priority 3 route, salting is now only being done on main routes. priority 1 and some priority 2 Routes. Gritting is continuing on priority 3 routes.

[d] Post Office Bridge there had been 2 meetings, with Ms Kilner of NDYNP and a Mr Gareth Evans a contractor. A clapper bridge would cost £6,200 A replacement road sign would be about £2,500. Grants are being looked for and the project remains work in progress.
