YDNPA Update (from Will)

- Car park improvement works are starting 13th January parking area near toilet blocks will be re-laid with improved drainage and the triangle of grass near the entrance will have removable fencing installed to allow for seasonal parking if/when dry enough.
- Ash Die Back 3 x trees felled in the car park in December.
- Landscape trail Some erosion of the path surface and the riverbank caused by recent flooding along section from Malham village towards Janet's Foss. Looking at what repairs are needed.
- Gordale Agreed with landowner to replace the gates at the entrance/roadside. Awaiting materials from supplier. Some erosion of the path surface in recent flooding will need repairing also.
- Awaiting confirmation of Budgets for 2025/26 to confirm which Projects can be completed. Cawden path
 improvements have been put forward as the highest priority Public Right Of Way project in the Southern
 area of the National Park.
